

## Whitewater Free Flowing Well – 53 miles

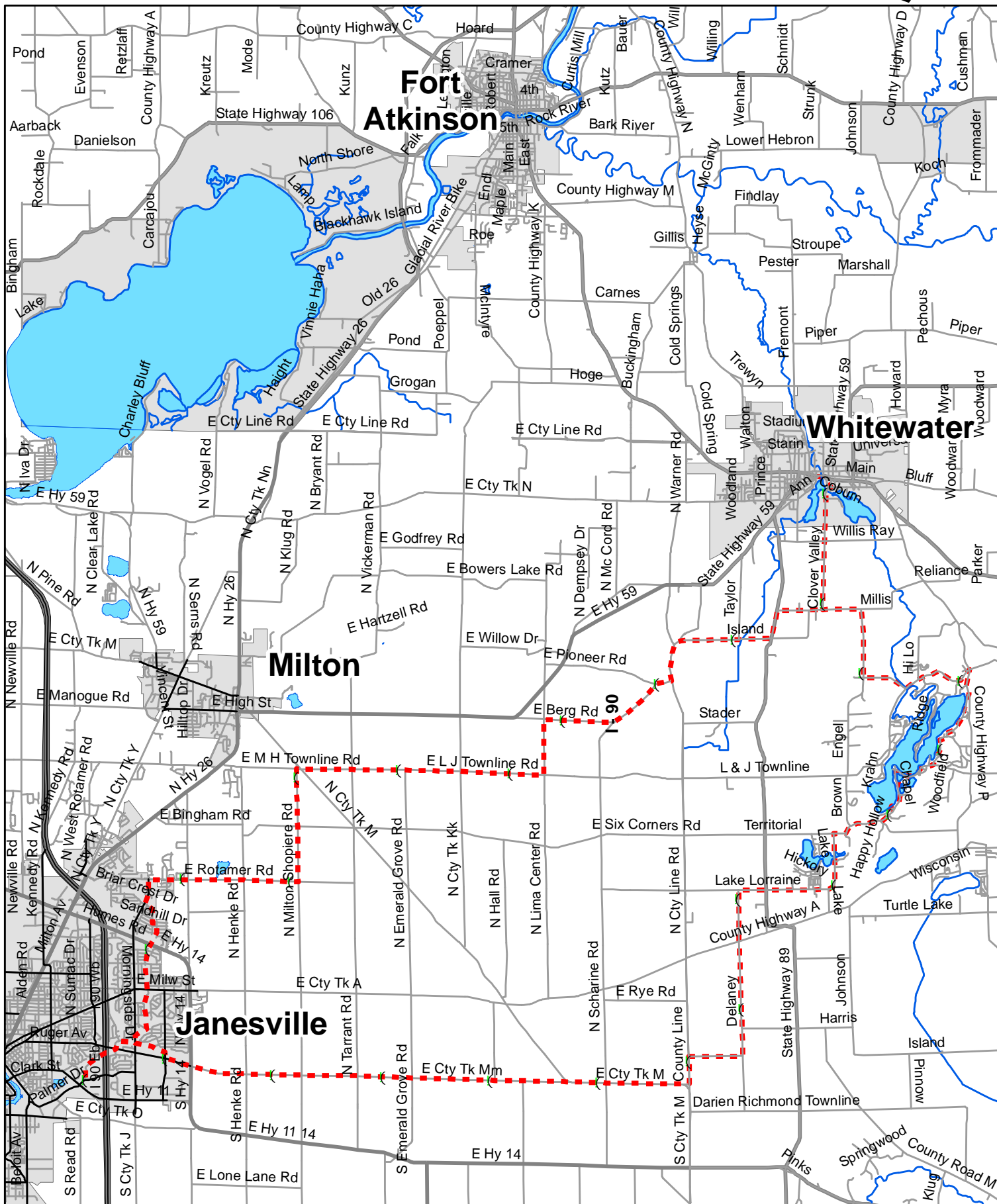
An artesian well with cold flowing water makes this route a great ride for a warm day. The route does not encounter towns or villages in the 53 miles of hard surface riding. Using town roads, county highways and a ½ mile stretch of a state highway this is the best ride to get away from traffic.

Flat terrain will be encountered for the first ⅓<sup>rd</sup> of the route; however things will change on the approach to the glaciated area surrounding Whitewater Lake. The south side will feature numerous up and down hills as you circle through the many beautiful summer homes that surround the lake. The lake is home to several youth camps and Whitewater Lake State Park. The state park features numerous picnic areas, swimming and camping.

One mile north of the park, on Engel Road is the artesian well. An easy detour can be made into Whitewater; home of the state university. A quiet city, especially in the summer; you will find numerous eating, drinking, lodging and cycle facilities.

If the wind is blowing from the east and you like to hammer; consider doing the route clockwise. County Trunk M and MM is a flat smooth raceway with little traffic. In the know cyclists try to end their ride with a fast pace line and a tail wind.
